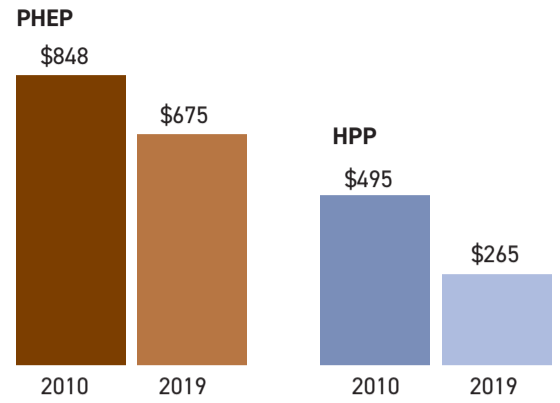

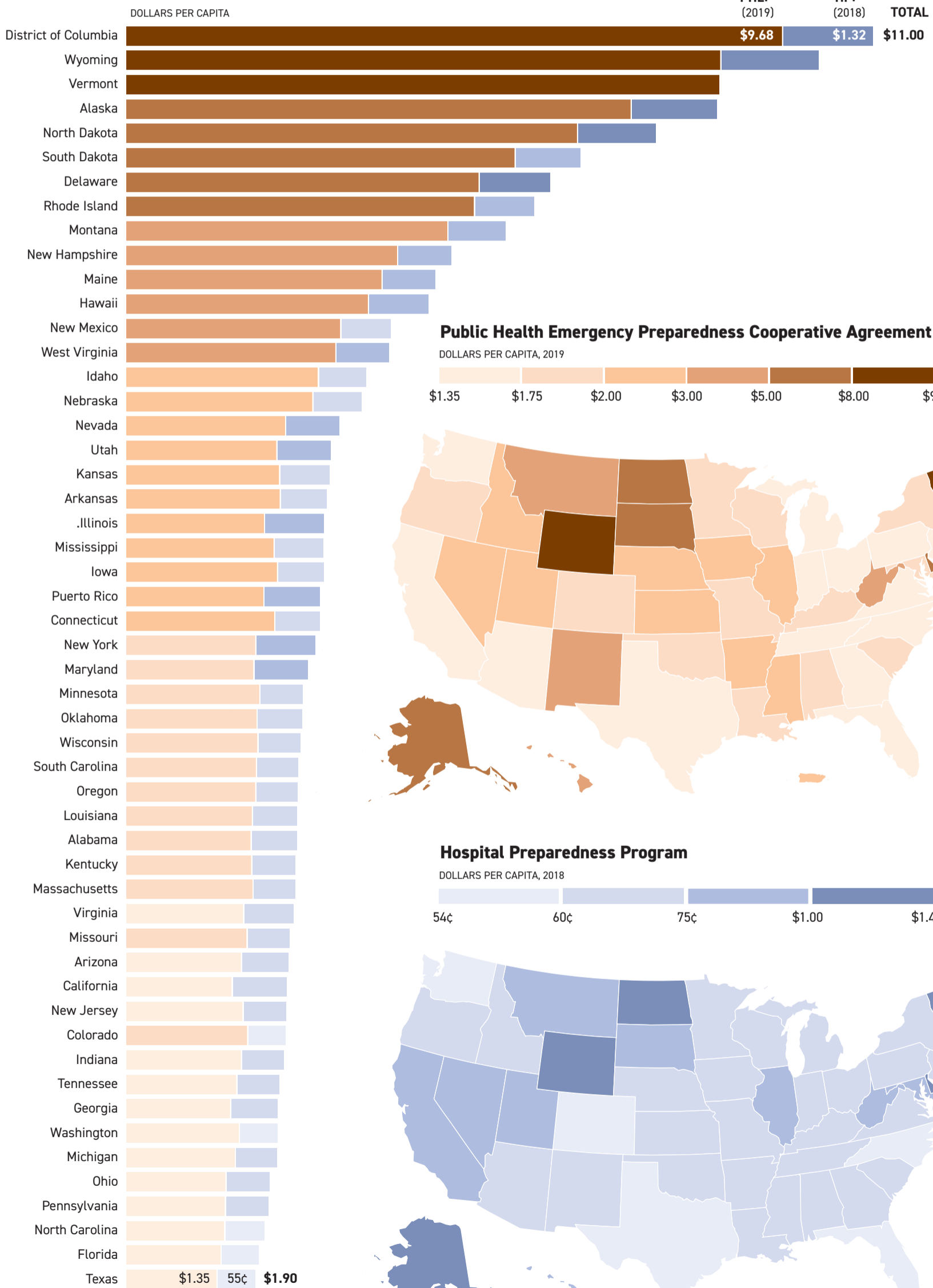
Federal health emergency preparedness programs cut 30 percent since 2010

The Public Health Emergency Preparedness Cooperative Agreement and the Hospital Preparedness Program provide federal funding to help health departments and hospitals prepare for public health security threats, such as natural disasters and pandemics. Since 2010, funding for PHEP and HPP have been cut by 20.4 percent and 46.5 percent respectively, when adjusting for inflation. The most recent White House budget sought to cut HPP by another \$18 million.
